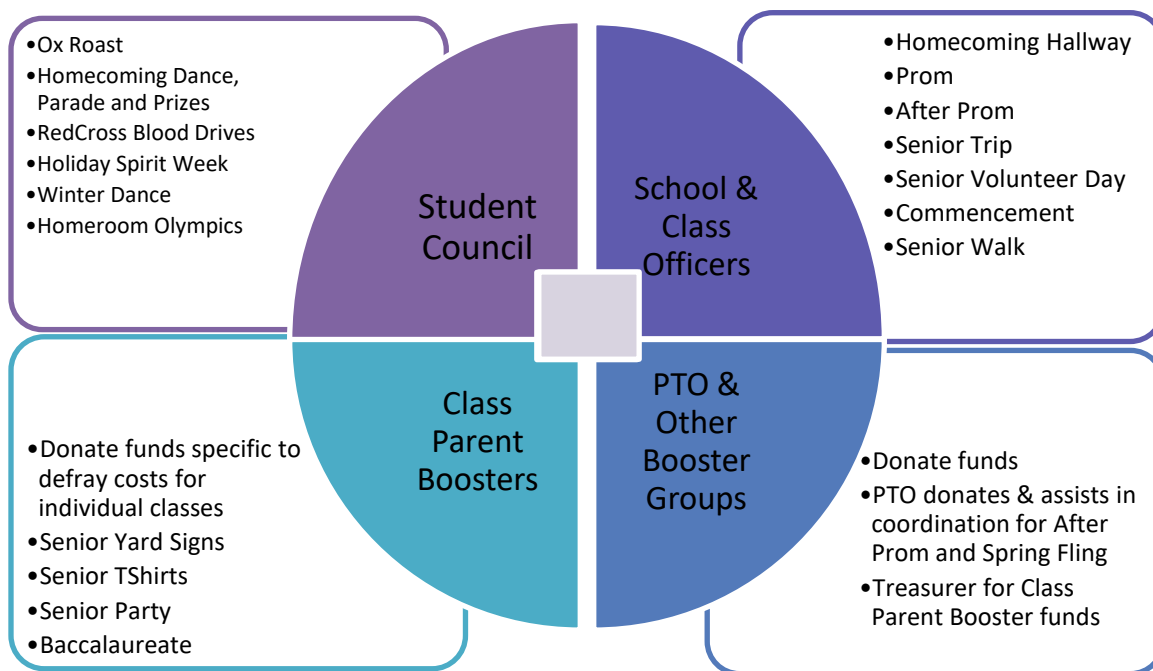


Groups: Who are they and what do they do?

- Student Council is a peer-elected body of representatives whose primary function is to serve and represent the interests of the student body.
- PTO is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) parent-driven organization dedicated to spreading district wide pride through sponsoring quality programming and events for parents and students. PTO oversees the Parent led After Prom and Senior Spring Fling event. PTO donates to and organizes beverages for Homecoming and Winter Dances.
- Class Parent Booster Groups raise funds to defray costs for Classes and coordinates some Senior Year optional activities (t-shirts, yard signs, Baccalaureate, Senior Class party)



Funds: How does the financial process work?

- In general, funds raised by students remain in School District accounts and are managed exclusively for school directed activities. Each class should expect to have \$?? In their account each year.
- In general, funds raised by Parent groups remain in separate bank accounts, under the PTO, and may be withdrawn at any time by those groups for their purposes.
- Student Council raises funds independent of Parents. Those funds are kept in School accounts. Money not used by this group ????(goes where? Stays behind for next year overall council?)
- Classes raise funds how? And where does that money go?
- PTO reviews requests for and may donate funds to Student Groups, other Booster groups (e.g. Band) or the School. PTO traditionally has provided some funding support for After Prom, Yearbook and Spring Fling. PTO oversees the parental leadership for both After Prom and Spring Fling.
- Parent Booster groups raise funds through a variety of activities. Funds raised are deposited in Arlington Bank. The Class Parent Booster accounts are kept in and reported by the PTO Treasurer. Funds may be withdrawn by parents at any time they request funds for their purposes. Funds remaining at the end of a Classes Senior year may be donated to the Class for their future alumni activities.
- Parent Booster groups, like any Booster group, reviews requests for and may donate funds to Student groups.
